The Salvation Army launched the Under 35s Board Participant Program in 2021, following a group of young salvationists voicing their desire to see the 'under 35' cohort actively involved in and contributing to the senior leadership and governance of The Salvation Army in Australia.

Participating Observer Status on the Board

As a participating observer, the Under 35 Board Participant will attend all Board meetings with full access to the information being considered at each meeting and any additional communications provided to the Board. The Salvation Army Australia is a vast movement with substantial legal liabilities for Board members. To protect the Under 35 Board Participant from legal liability, this position will not carry a Board vote. However, full participation in all discussions will be encouraged.

Under 35 Board Participant Program - Summary of Requirements

The Under 35 Board Participant will:

- Attend all Board meetings (seven per year) as a participating observer
- Attend either the Professional Standards Committee or the Quality and Safety Committee as a participating observer
- Attend one meeting per year of either the Professional Standards Committee or the Quality and Safety Committee (whichever Committee they do not attend) as an observer
- Attend one meeting per year of the Audit and Risk Committee as an observer
- Complete all integrity check requirements
- Complete all mandatory training modules
- Complete a Confidentiality Agreement
- Complete a Conflict of Interest Declaration
- Complete a Responsible Person Declaration
- Complete a Board Member Role Profile
- Participate in a formal mentoring arrangement with another Board member
- Complete the formal induction process

Participating Observer of one Committee

As a participating observer of one of the Board Committees, the Under 35 Board Participant will attend and actively participate in all meetings for this Committee. The Board Participant will have full access to the information for all meetings and any additional communications provided.

Observer Status with two Committees

As an observer of two of the Board Committees, the Under 35 Board Participant will attend and observe one of each of these Committee meetings annually and will have full access to the information provided for each meeting.

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The Application and Appointment Process

- All expression of interest forms are to be emailed to the Secretary to the Property Trusts via liz.cruickshank@salvationarmy.org.au by close of business on **25 March 2024**
- The Divisional Commander and Corps Officer for each applicant will be contacted by the Secretary to the Property Trusts for further discussion
- A shortlist of suitable applicants will be selected based on skills, experience, expertise and diversity
- Shortlisted applicants will undergo a formal interview by the interview panel comprising the Chair of the Board, the Alternate Chair, the Lead Independent and the Secretary to the Property Trusts
- The interview panel will present the nominated applicant to the Board for approval
- Upon completion of all required integrity checks and a formal induction, the Under 35
 Board Participant will commence attending Board meetings and Committee meetings (as
 previously outlined)

Length of Tenure

The Under 35 Board Participant will be appointed for an initial term of six months. This initial term may be extended by one or more further terms to a maximum of three years in total, with each extension subject to a review of the individual's performance on the Board, the recommendation of the Chair of the Board and approval by the Board.

Performance Reviews

The Under 35 Board Participant will undertake a performance review with the Chair of the Board, the Alternate Chair of the Board and the Secretary to the Property Trusts, prior to the completion of each term of appointment.

Remuneration

The Under 35 Board Participant is a voluntary position. The Salvation Army will reimburse any approved out of pocket expenses and cover all approved travel related costs.

Any Senior Soldier of The Salvation Army who will be under the age of 35 years as of 30 June 2024, and is an active member of their corps and not a Salvation Army employee, is encouraged to apply by completing the attached expression of interest form.
