The Noel Jones Series is designed to meet the demands of a wide range of ensembles; therefore it has been written and arranged for a minimum of five brass players plus percussion. While being designed for smaller ensembles the level of ability and experience required to play the music varies from easy to moderately difficult works.

The addition of extra musicians will create a fuller sound and the use of cued tonal colours will enhance the overall performance of the music.

Additional parts for woodwind and other brass instruments have been included with the score. Some alternative instruments can utilise the appropriate brass part as indicated in the following lists.

Bandmaster Lindsay Stow, Warrnambool Corps, provides a welcome addition to the Christmas repertoire available for small bands. We are confident this new work will be used by many bands as they proclaim the message of Christmas. Lindsay provides the following notes:

The Midnight Clear was written in 2011 for the Warrnambool Corps band's participation in a community Christmas parade in Mortlake, a small country town in Western Victoria.

My intention, when initially giving consideration this march, was to utilise some Christmas melodies that were not quite so well known and not so commonly or widely used in other Christmas compositions. The march contains two main themes, 'A Virgin Most Pure' (New Christmas Praise, 4), and 'It Came Upon A Midnight Clear – Willlis' (New Christmas Praise, 45), melodies that in original form are written in 3/4 and 6/8 time respectively, but which I feel work well in a 4/4 march setting. In addition to these two main themes the march also contains snippets of The First Nowell and We Wish You A Merry Christmas.

The style should generally be kept light throughout this piece, but with careful attention given to dynamics and marked articulation to ensure added contrast and interest at appropriate points. The tempo, while brisk, should be unhurried to allow accurate measurement and placement of semi-quaver figures and shared rhythmic figures.
