Social Action Opportunity

Intro

He urges us to explore innovative solutions for the incredibly complex and often long-term nature of societal challenges within the communities we serve.

Explore

Brainstorm two columns on a whiteboard. On the left, list bad things we want to stop, and on the right hand side, list corresponding longer-term systemic changes that could replace those bad things with good news stories.

- ▶ What challenges have we experienced with such partnerships?

- ▶ What are the key challenges that our community is currently facing?
- ▶ What partnerships can we instigate to foster creativity, compassion and joy in our community?

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Social Action Possibility

Intro

As Christian leaders, who seek to love God and others, we have a responsibility to engage in social action. Dr Russell Rook suggests that our engagement can be classified into four categories: contradiction, contrast, complement and collaboration.

Explore

- ▶ Write the four categories (contradiction, contrast, complement, collaborate) on a whiteboard or large sheet of paper.
- ▶ In what ways are we already engaging in social action in each of these categories?

Distribute yellow post-it notes and markers. Write one answer on each and place them into each of the four categories.

- ▶ What other opportunities do you see in each of these categories within our community?

Distribute green post-it notes. Write one answer on each and place them into each of the four categories.

Apply

- ▶ What evidence indicates that there is a need in this area?
- ▶ Why would we give priority to this opportunity?
- ▶ Have government or other organisations already invested in addressing this need?
- ▶ Is our initiative one that would reflect current research and thinking on holistic service provision?
- ▶ How could we collaborate and share knowledge with other Salvo expressions who are currently addressing or thinking of addressing this need?
- ▶ What resources would be required? For example, people, money, building, advertising etc.
- ▶ Is there funding available? If not, then how could we source funds for this initiative?
- ▶ How could we ensure that this initiative could be sustained if funding were to cease?
- ▶ Who might we partner with in this initiative?



Social Action Challenge

Intro

Dr Russell Rook notes that we share with this planet with 22.5 million refugees. According to [The Guardian](#), “more than 24000 humanitarian arrivals settled in Australia” within the 2016-2017 financial year. Many more continue to seek the peace and safety of our communities. Russell challenges us to consider how we can reach out and welcome these families.

Explore

- ▶ How do we help refugees within our communities to find safety, healing and a solid foundation for their new life?
- ▶ What joy have you found in seeing refugees integrate into our community?
- ▶ How have you seen our community change and be changed by welcoming refugees?

- ▶ What are other agencies doing within our community to welcome and support refugees and asylum seekers?
- ▶ Do we have the capacity to reach out to those in immigration detention whether within Australia or in overseas centres?
- ▶ How can we better advocate for those who are waiting for the determination of their request for asylum in Australia?

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
