



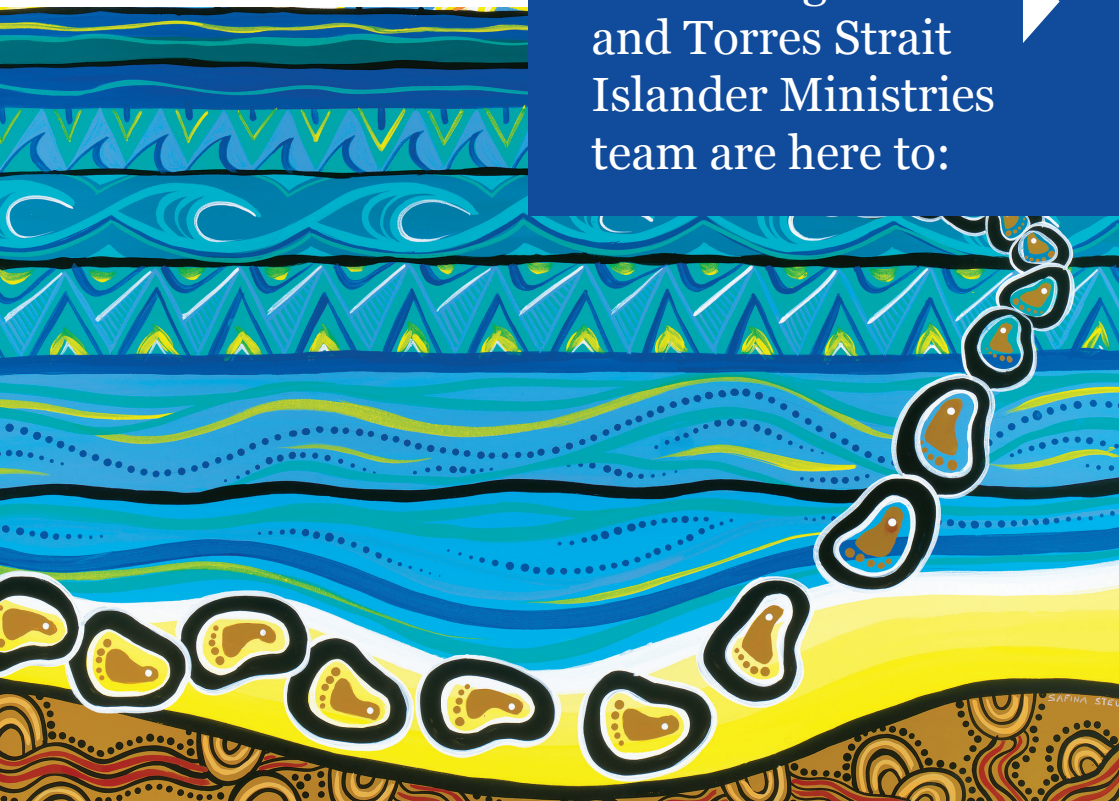

## Care for People

- consult on the cultural appropriateness of any materials or resources developed.
- provide guidance on how to assist your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community to access Salvation Army services and programs.
- educate you and your team on the significance of a Welcome to Country or Acknowledgement of Country at community events or church services.



## Build Healthy Communities

- provide connection to your local Elders and traditional Owners / Custodians.
- advise on how to create services and ministries that are culturally inclusive, appropriate and accessible to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- provide support for events such as NAIDOC celebrations. We have a grant matching scheme that could even help finance part of it.



## Create Faith Pathways

- help you work out how to start spiritual conversations that convey a commitment to reconciliation and healing.
- help you to create a space where Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people can feel safe, valued and respected to use their gifts and to grow.
- provide speakers (or suggestions of speakers) for Church services and events.



## Work for Justice

- encourage all Salvation Army expressions to think beyond charity to include justice and advocacy as a central part of their response to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.
- empower you to champion Indigenous affairs in your community. We can provide advice and support.
- help broker a relationship with Indigenous and non-Indigenous community members to promote reconciliation within your local area.
