

His Story, My Story - Session 7

Jesus Appears on the Road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-37)

Sharing exercise

Can you tell us briefly about one of the happiest times in your life?

Introduction

I am going to tell you a story from the Bible. We are actually going to hear this story three times. The first time, I want you to imagine the story. The second time, I want you to remember the story. And the third time, you are going to help me tell the story. Listen carefully because you are going to have to help me retell it, and we'll also talk some more about the story afterwards.

This story is told in the Bible my Luke.

First time

Late in the afternoon, on the Sunday after Jesus died, two of his followers were walking to the village of Emmaus, seven miles out of Jerusalem. As they walked along, they talked about Jesus' death on the cross. Then Jesus caught up with them and began walking beside them. But they were not able to recognize who he was.

He asked, 'What are you talking about so seriously as you walk along?'

They stopped, with sadness written across their faces. One of them, Cleopas, said, 'You must be the only person in Jerusalem who hasn't heard about all the things that have happened there the last few days.'

'What things?' Jesus asked.

'The things that happened to Jesus, the man from Nazareth,' they said. 'He was a prophet. He did powerful miracles. And he was a mighty teacher. We could all see that. But our chief priests and authorities handed him over to be executed—crucified even.'

'We were hoping he was the Messiah who had come to rescue Israel. But three days ago, Jesus died on a cross.'



'Then early this morning, some women from our group went to his tomb. And they came back with an amazing report. They said his body was missing, and they had seen angels who told them Jesus is alive! Some of our men ran out to see, and his body was gone, just like the women had said.'

Third time

5. This week, what do you want to change in your life because of this story? State your answer in the form "This week I want to..."
6. Who else needs to hear this story?
