EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN

Day care	A child can attend this school when s(he) turns 5 years old by the end of July.
Pre school	A state-wide exam that year 12 students do that influence colleges and university entry
Kindergarten	School that are run by private organisations and charge school fees.
Primary school	An English school for high school aged children who are new to Australia and do not speak English well
Secondary/High school	A form of child care that is available during the day and may be subsidised by the government
Higher School Certificate (HSC)	A form of child care that is usually privately owned and not subsidised by the government
Intensive English High School (IEHS)	Schools that are run by the government and do not charge school fees apart from books, uniforms and excursions
Public school	The first 6 years of schooling - Grade 1 to 6
Private school	The continuation of primary school - Grade 7 to 12



EDUCATION FOR ADULTS

Postgraduate course	Free English language class for adult from the government
AMEP	On-the-job training you can do while studying at TAFE
Apprenticeship	A course that you do after obtaining a Bachelor degree
Study loan	An option of study where you can study 2 or 3 days/week only
TAFE	A place where you can study for a Bachelor or Master degree.
Undergraduate course	An option of study where you need to study 4-5 days/week
University	Usually offer vocational courses with apprenticeship opportunities
Full time	Usually your first study at a University and you will get a Bachelor degree
Part time	Financial assistance from the government to undertake further education
Vocational course	A course that offer practical knowledge and skills for a specific job
Education	Skills and knowledge learned from a school, college or university
