<p>Lesson aims: By the end of the lesson participants should be aware of the pathway to employment and job application process in Australia</p>	
<p>Specific learning outcomes: By the end of the lesson, participants should be able to understand and say:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Job capacity assessment• Jobactive• Employment service• Work training• Work experience• Referee• Cover letter• CV/Resume• Interview	<p>Assessment methods: Facilitators to listen to participants' pronunciation and check understanding on key vocabularies related to pathway to employment and job application process</p>
<p>Previous knowledge assumed: low</p>	
<p>Materials and equipment required: Whiteboard, markers, "Employment Pathway in Australia" and "How to Apply for a Job" handouts</p>	
<p>Room layout: U and O shapes</p>	
<p>General notes on differentiation / learning styles: facilitating techniques involve auditory, visual and kinaesthetic methods.</p>	
<p>Anticipated problems and solutions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Some participants may have difficulty pronouncing "capacity", "referee", "enquire", "Curriculum Vitae"<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Model and drill the pronunciation many times.• Some participants may have difficulty understanding "job capacity assessment" and "referee" concepts<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Facilitators to spend a bit more time explaining these two concepts.
