Inside your resource pack

Below you will find a list of resources included in the Red Shield Appeal pack.

Promotional resources

Posters – Available in A4, A3, A1 sizes. Please display these in your corps building, at schools, local shopping centres, community notice boards, local business partners, local club/pub etc.

Fence banners – Please display these in high-traffic locations in your community. Common places include pedestrian overpass bridges, outside McDonald's (with permission), outside Family Stores, along highways (with council permission).

Volunteer registration cards – Use these to gather volunteer registration information. Hand out at schools, to local businesses, and give some to your weekly program leaders to hand out (e.g. mini music, playgroup).

Doorknock resources

Lanyards – Provided to all volunteers (not just doorknockers) as a form of identification as an official volunteer.

ID tags – Provided to all volunteers (not just doorknockers). Clips onto lanyard. Volunteer should fill in their name, and get their supervisor's signature before going out to volunteer.

Receipt books



Receipt books – Provided to all volunteers (not just doorknockers). Volunteers should complete a receipt for every donation of \$2 or more. Please encourage volunteers to write neatly and clearly and ensure the carbon copy page is behind the thick writing cardboard.

Translation cards



Carry bags – Provided to all Doorknock volunteers and contains all resources they need to carry while doorknocking.

Ziplock bags – Provided to all Doorknock volunteers to store cash donations they receive while doorknocking.

Translation cards – Provided to all volunteers (not just doorknockers). Contains 18 translations of the phrase, “The Salvation Army helps all people in need. You can make a difference. Will you please make a donation?”

Community collection resources

A-frame signage – Foldable signage to be used at community collection sites.

Bucket with lid and handle



Bucket with lid and handle – Buckets should be secured with cable ties while in use.

Volunteer apron/bib – Provided to volunteers as a form of identification as an official volunteer.

Pistol grip bucket – For use at collection sites to hold donations (in conjunction with lids)

Pistol grip lid – For use at collection sites (in conjunction with bases). These are one time only use lids.

Appreciation certificates



Appreciation certificates – All volunteers should receive an appreciation certificate (if they desire). There are word document templates available on the Web App, (under the Handbook and Runsheet section) at: volunteer.salvos.org.au which you can use to mail merge large numbers of volunteers at the same time.

Mcdonald's vouchers – All volunteers should receive a McDonald's voucher (if they desire).

Stickers – These stickers can be handed out at collection sites to donors as a thank you. They can also be given to volunteers as a thank you.

Balloons – Balloons can also be used at collection sites as a thank you to donors (especially kids). You can also use balloons at your counting house to create a festive atmosphere.

Payment technology

Westpac EFTPOS machine – These machines are loaned to us free of charge for the month of May by Westpac Bank. The battery can last up to 8 hours. These machines can accept PayWave, Swipe and Insert cards from Visa, Amex, Mastercard and Eftpos.

Quest Tap & Go machine – The Salvation Army purchase or lease these devices and come at a significant cost to us. Please ensure they are taken care of and are not lost. These machines are pre-set at a determined amount but this can be changed on the portal (speak with your RM). They can accept PayWave cards only, from Visa and Mastercard. These machines must be plugged into a power outlet, or battery pack.

Battery pack – These are for use with the Quest Tap & Go Machines.

Tap & Go signage (large) – A large corflute stand which folds in half. These have a small cut out area, where a Quest Tap & Go Machine can be inserted. To watch a video of this sign being set up go to: volunteer.salvos.org.au/App/Library/Asset/25

Tap & Go signage (tabletop) – A smaller corflute stand to sit on a table. There is a small cut out area, where a Quest Tap & Go machine can be inserted.
