Sometimes we look around at the world, with its busyness, demands and problems, and think “Is there something more than this?”


We think if we could just fix this or have that or be with that person, things would be better.

more.

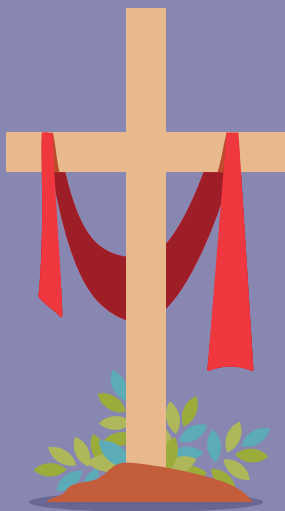





History records the arrival of a man
