Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people love music and dance which are an integral part of their culture which is used for passing on stories and keeping the rhythm when working, dancing and singing.

The sticks can be decorated and carved to show individuality and purpose.

Women also use the sticks for digging bush tucker (root vegetables like yams)
