### EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN

<b>Day care</b>	A child can attend this school when s(he) turns 5 years old by the end of July.
<b>Pre school</b>	A state-wide exam that year 12 students do that influence colleges and university entry
<b>Kindergarten</b>	School that are run by private organisations and charge school fees.
<b>Primary school</b>	An English school for high school aged children who are new to Australia and do not speak English well
<b>Secondary/High school</b>	A form of child care that is available during the day and may be subsidised by the government
<b>Higher School Certificate (HSC)</b>	A form of child care that is usually privately owned and not subsidised by the government
<b>Intensive English High School (IEHS)</b>	Schools that are run by the government and do not charge school fees apart from books, uniforms and excursions
<b>Public school</b>	The first 6 years of schooling - Grade 1 to 6
<b>Private school</b>	The continuation of primary school - Grade 7 to 12



## EDUCATION FOR ADULTS

<b>Postgraduate course</b>	Free English language class for adult from the government
<b>AMEP</b>	On-the-job training you can do while studying at TAFE
<b>Apprenticeship</b>	A course that you do after obtaining a Bachelor degree
<b>Study loan</b>	An option of study where you can study 2 or 3 days/week only
<b>TAFE</b>	A place where you can study for a Bachelor or Master degree.
<b>Undergraduate course</b>	An option of study where you need to study 4-5 days/week
<b>University</b>	Usually offer vocational courses with apprenticeship opportunities
<b>Full time</b>	Usually your first study at a University and you will get a Bachelor degree
<b>Part time</b>	Financial assistance from the government to undertake further education
<b>Vocational course</b>	A course that offer practical knowledge and skills for a specific job
<b>Education</b>	Skills and knowledge learned from a school, college or university
