Child care

- For children aged 0–5

Pre-schools

- Aged 4 y.o on/before 30 April

Primary schools (Year 1-6)

- Aged 5 y.o on/before 30 April
- Year 1 is called kindergarten in the ACT

High schools (Year 7-10)

- Exploring & choosing area of interests to pursue later

Secondary Colleges (Year 11-12)

- Preparing for both work & further education

Specialist Schools

- For students with disability

Other

- Refugee Bridging Program (Year 11 & 12 program)
- Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander education
- Vocational education & training (VET)



Introductory English Centres (IECs)

English language program for newly arrived students with low level of English before going to schools



EDUCATION FOR ADULTS



AMEP (Adult Migrant English Program)

Free English class for eligible new arrivals to Australia to improve English language skills.



TAFE (Technical and Further Education)

Vocational education and training. Qualifications include Certificate and Diploma.



University

Tertiary education in various courses. Qualifications include Bachelor and Master degree.
