In an emergency always ring triple zero (000) to get assistance from Police, Fire and Ambulance.



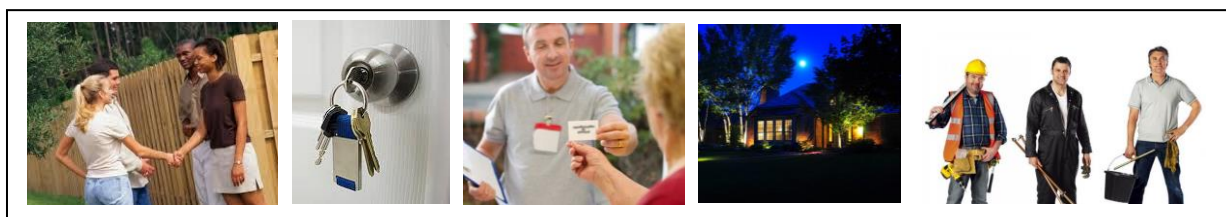
Fire Safety

- Fire blankets are to put out small fire. Eg. stove, candles. Do **NOT** put out big fire.
- Install an adequate number of suitable [smoke alarms](#) and test them regularly.
- Write an [escape plan](#) in case of fire and practice it regularly.
- Make sure keys to all doors/windows are readily accessible if needed to escape.
- Never leave cooking or any other open flame including candles or oil burners unattended.
- Always switch off electric blankets before going to bed or leaving the house.
- Heating equipment should be installed by a qualified person with Australian standard.
- Gas leak is a fire risk. Get out from the house, turn off main meter if possible or call 000.
- Do not cover heater with clothes etc. Do not leave it on all night.
- Do not overload power points



Home Safety

- Get to know your neighbours. Exchange phone numbers and keep an eye on each other's homes.
- Ensure doors and windows are secured, particularly in areas that are unoccupied.
- Remove keys from internal doors and windows when you are not at home.
- Don't leave a house key under the door mat, a pot plant or in other obvious places.
- Check references of a hired trades person, gardener, home cleaner etc.
- Ask for identifications from all salespersons who request entry to your home. If you're doubtful, check with the person's office.
- Give your home the "lived in" look when you're out - leave the light and radio on.
- Keep cash, keys and valuables out of sight and out of easy reach.
- Don't leave notes on the door as they suggest that no one is home.
- Ensure your house number is clearly visible so it can be located quickly in an emergency.
