No. of participants: Level: Intermediate level Topic: Introducing education system in South Australia for children and adults	
Lesson aims: By the end of the lesson, participants should be aware of available education options for children and adults in WA	
Specific learning outcomes: By the end of the lesson, participants should be able to understand key terms and pronounce them. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Day care or child care• Pre-school or kindergarten• Primary school• Secondary or high school• WACE and ATAR• Study loans• Full time / part-time• Vocational Education Training (VET)• Apprenticeship• Undergraduate / Postgraduate course	Assessment methods: Facilitators to listen to participants' pronunciation on key vocabularies in children's and adult's education. Facilitators to check participants' understanding of key vocabularies through a class exercise.
Previous knowledge assumed: having done the beginner's lesson on the Education topic	
Materials and equipment required: Whiteboard, markers, "Information on Education for Children" , "Information on Education for Adults" , and "Education for children and adults – Class exercise" handouts	
Room layout: U and O shapes	
General notes on differentiation / learning styles: facilitating techniques involve auditory, visual and kinaesthetic methods.	
Anticipated problems and solutions: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Some participants may have difficulty pronouncing "undergraduate", "postgraduate", "vocational" and "apprenticeship"<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Model and drill the pronunciation many times.	



- **Some participants may have difficulty understanding the concept “apprenticeship”**
 - Facilitators to spend a bit more time explaining this concept with illustrations and examples.
- **Some participants may have difficulty pronouncing “vocational” and “apprenticeship”**
 - Model and drill the pronunciation many times.
- **Some participants may have difficulties differentiating between a college and a university**
 - Facilitators to spend a bit more time explaining these two terms.

(15 min)	Activity 1 – Class Exercise (in pairs) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Distribute the “Education for Children and Adults – Class Exercise” and ask participants to do it in pairs ● Ask each pair to provide an answer ● Check participants’ understanding on key words in children’s and adults’ education through their answers ● Re-explain certain words that participants’ have difficulties understanding 	Do exercise in pairs Discuss answers with their partner Share answers to the class Listen	“Education for Children and Adults – Class Exercise” handouts
