EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN & YOUNG ADULTS

Child Care

A school specifically designed to support students with special needs.

Preschool

A national examination for year 12 students that will influence university entry

Primary school

Year 7-10, where students have the opportunity to explore their interests through different curriculum options.

High school

Care for children aged from birth to 5 year old. Usually for parents who work full-time.

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)

A specialised education support to learners who are new to Australia and have low English language skills.

Secondary school

The first years of schooling – Year 1 to 6

Intensive English Centres (IECs)

Care and education for children aged 4. Have shorter hours than child care.

Specialist school

Year 11 to 12, where students receive guidance in deciding courses of study for further education or to pursue a career.



EDUCATION FOR ADULTS

Postgraduate course	Free English language class for adult from the government
AMEP	On-the-job training you can do while studying at TAFE
Apprenticeship	A course that you do after obtaining a Bachelor degree
Study loan	An option of study where you can study 2 or 3 days/week only
TAFE	A place where you can study for a Bachelor or Master degree.
Undergraduate course	An option of study where you need to study 4-5 days/week
University	Usually offer vocational courses with apprenticeship opportunities
Full time	Usually your first study at a University and you will get a Bachelor degree
Part time	Financial assistance from the government to undertake further education
