Mission in the Solomon Islands

The Salvation Army launched in the Solomon Islands 11 years ago. Today, the work is flourishing.

There are now 11 Salvation Army village churches, and four couples are preparing to enter The Salvation Army's training college for officers!

The first couple to head off for training in Papua New Guinea will be Wency and Fostina Ramo'oroa. Young and full of joy, Wency and Fostina love Jesus and long to serve him.

Australian officers, Majors Robert and Vanessa Evans lead the mission in the Solomon Islands. They work closely with local leaders, but appointing corps officers would take things to the next level. Indigenous officers who understand the language and culture are key to effective mission.

The new corps officers will need houses to live in — and you can help!

This year's Making it Happen project aims to raise \$120,000 to build and furnish a home for corps officers in one of these villages. The house would also be a missional hub for Salvos and a space for service to the wider community.
