



INTERGENERATIONAL MEETING PLAN



Time	Activity	Description
Depends on the Territory	Activity	<p>Everyone gets a Post-it note before entering the hall or chapel. They are asked to write down what they would like to hear.</p> <p>This can be a word or sentence from someone else or God. Examples: 'You can do it!' or 'You are not alone'. They keep the Post-it note with them.</p>
	Introduction (video)	Explanation about the International Day of Children and Young People.
	Praise and Worship (Theme song)	<p>A worship team consisting of all generations leads the praise and worship.</p> <p>Suggestion: Use the theme song as the first and/or last song.</p>
	Prayer	Led by different generations. For example: one child, one young person and one elderly person.
	Creative Scripture Reading	We encourage you to use the Bible recitation rap that you can find on the website.
	Special Contribution	<p>Encourage children and young people to use their talents and skills to share in the meeting.</p> <p>Think of different types of contributions: a brass band, worship dance, drawings, videos, songs, etc.</p>
	Sharing	<p>By sharing our stories and listening to each other, we will grow our fellowship and learn how God works in and through others.</p> <p>Suggestion 1: Ask people to stand up and find four other individuals. Then ask them to share what they have written on their Post-it note within this group. Let them listen to each other. At the end of the conversation, ask them to return to their seats. Then ask what they have learned from this conversation and let some people respond.</p> <p>Suggestion 2: Ask three to five people to come forward and share what they have written on their Post-it notes. At the end of this time of sharing, ask everyone what they have learned by listening to the stories and let some people respond.</p>

Time	Activity	Description
Depends on the Territory	Message	<p>We believe in the priesthood of all believers. Today, we celebrate that we are all made in the image of God and are therefore people of value, regardless of age. So we encourage young people to deliver the message as much as possible.</p> <p>Option 1: A child or young person delivers the message, helped (in preparation) by a youth leader or the officer.</p> <p>Option 2: A youth leader delivers the message, with the help of children and young people.</p> <p>Option 3: The officer in charge of the corps delivers the message, with the help of children and young people.</p>
	Theme Song	Sing the theme song as affirmation.
	Response Time: Prayers on Prayer Cards	<p>Invite everyone to write a prayer on a prayer card. They can write a prayer for a child or young person and send this card to him/her. They can also write a prayer for themselves and keep the card.</p> <p>Option 1: Make sure there are cards and a pen under every person's seat before the meeting.</p> <p>Option 2: Invite people to come forward and write a prayer on a prayer card. Make sure some prayer cards and pens are put on the mercy seat or holiness table.</p>
	Benediction	Choose a benediction that focuses on children and young people.
