Overdose Awareness Day is an international campaign to end drug overdose and remember, without stigma, those who have died and acknowledge the grief of family and friends left behind.



Consider the sensitive nature of this topic and whether any of your corps members have been impacted by overdose. If you know someone has been impacted by this issue, consider how you can best support them and sensitively address this topic in your meeting. You might want to offer to pray for them specifically, invite them to pray during the service or ask them to contribute additional prayer points.

2024 theme

This year's theme is, 'Together we can' and highlights the power of our community when we all stand together.

History

Overdose Awareness Day was initiated in 2001 by Sally J Finn at The Salvation Army in St Kilda, Melbourne. Since then, many community members as well as government and non-government organisations have held events to raise awareness and commemorate those who have been impacted by drug overdose.

In 2012, the not-for-profit Australian public health organisation, Penington Institute, took on responsibility for the coordination of International Overdose Awareness Day. It is now a global event held every year on 31 August.

Facts

According to '[Australia's Annual Overdose Report](#)', one Australian dies as the result of drug overdose every four hours and in the past 20 years, over **37,000 people** have lost their lives in this manner.

- ▶ 75% of these deaths were accidental or unintentional
- ▶ On average, males account for 7/10 of these unintentional drug-induced deaths
- ▶ Drug overdose is one of the top three causes of death for Australian adults under the age of 50
- ▶ Unintentional drug-induced deaths have increased almost 300% for adults 50-59 years old over the past 20 years

We encourage you to take time to pray over this national concern, remember those affected and consider how we can work together to change these trends.
