Purpose

For all members of the church community to explore together who God created fathers and each of us, to be.

Consider & Prepare


God created each of us in His image. Reflecting on who God is and what he does, gives us an understanding of who He has created us to be. Remember that this will be a challenging day for some members of your church community. Keep the focus on who God is while making space to celebrate the role that fathers may play in our lives.

Take the time to read Psalm 89 and reflect on the character of God. Consider which of those characteristics you see reflected in your own life. Consider which of these characteristics you would love to see God develop further in you.

You Will Need

For Activity 1 – Characteristics of God the Father

- ❖ A set of cards – one characteristic written on each card from the list in the table.
- ❖ A sticky wall – Hang a large sheet of fabric and spray it with fabric adhesive. This is available from Spotlight, Lincraft or craft stores. You will be able to stick and remove cards from it.
- ❖ If you do not want to create a sticky wall then you can supply blu-tac instead.
- ❖ Optional – some small prizes for correctly identifying the characteristic, making the fastest freeze frame, making the most creative freeze frame, etc.



For Activity 2 – Roles of God the Father

- ❖ Copies of the verses in Appendix A – one copy per group
- ❖ Nine blank cards per group
- ❖ Markers or pens

For Activity 3 – How am I like God?

- ❖ Depending on the option that you choose, you will need a flat pack item, or a picnic blanket
- ❖ Optional – some small prizes for your volunteers

For Prayer Activity

- ❖ Set up a simple obstacle course

Prayer Activity + Opportunity for Reflection and Response

- ❖ Print multiple copies of the verses in Appendix B
- ❖ Cut the verses up into individual cards
- ❖ Put them in a box or basket or scatter them across a table
- ❖ Blank cards
- ❖ Markers or pens

Call to Worship

Psalm 89 - selected verses (CEV)

“Our Lord, I will sing of your love forever. Everyone yet to be born will hear me praise your faithfulness. ² I will tell them, “God’s love can always be trusted, and his faithfulness lasts as long as the heavens.”

⁵ Our Lord, let the heavens now praise your miracles, and let all of your angels praise your faithfulness. None who live in the heavens can compare with you.

⁸ You are Lord God All-Powerful! No one is as loving and faithful as you are. ⁹ You rule the roaring sea and calm its waves. ¹¹ The heavens and the earth belong to you. And so does the world with all its people because you created them ¹² and everything else.

¹³ You are strong and mighty! ¹⁴ Your kingdom is ruled by justice and fairness with love and faithfulness leading the way.

Introduction – Focus on THE Father

As we worship today, we want to keep our minds firmly focused on our Heavenly Father. This is what true worship is. We also want to acknowledge the gift of fatherhood that God has given to us.

Today is Father’s Day. We understand that there will be a variety of responses amongst us.

Whatever your experience is of your father or as a father, it is important to remember that God is a Good Father. He helps us to understand who fathers were created to be. Today we are going to explore this together.

Activity 1 – Characteristics of God

There are fathers within our church family too. They may or may not actually have children of their own but they take on the role of father to people within our church.

I wonder what positive characteristics you see in your own father or in a father within our church family? Allow for some responses.

Divide into groups of approximately five people, with a mix of ages in each group.

Read out each of the following verses one at a time.

I am going to read out some verses that tell us about who God is. After I read each verse you can discuss with your group then call out the characteristic that we learn about in the verse. You will then have 30 seconds for your group to work out a freeze frame to represent that characteristic. A freeze frame is like a still mime.

God is love, and anyone who doesn't love others has never known Him. 1 John 4:8	Loving
The Lord isn't slow about keeping his promises, as some people think He is. In fact, God is patient, because He wants everyone to turn from sin and no one to be lost. 2 Peter 3:9	Patient
Just as parents are kind to their children, the Lord is kind to all who worship him, because He knows we are made of dust. Psalm 103:13-14	Kind
As bad as you are, you still know how to give good gifts to your children. But your heavenly Father is even more ready to give good things to people who ask. Matthew 7:11	Generous
Have pity on others, just as your Father has pity on you. Luke 6:36	Merciful
Always live as God's holy people should, because God is the one who chose you, and He is holy. 1 Peter 1:15	Holy
Be my defender and protector! Keep your promise and save my life. Psalm 119:154	Defender
You judge the world fairly and treat all nations with justice. Psalm 9:8	Fair

As you complete each one, take a card with that characteristic and ask someone to add it to the sticky wall.

Link 1

These are just some of the characteristics of God the Father that we might also see in earthly fathers.

Hebrews 12:9 says

Our earthly fathers correct us, and we still respect them. Isn't it even better to be given true life by letting our spiritual Father correct us?

Fathers can have characteristics that are like those of God. They also have roles within families and within the church family that may be similar to the roles that God has in our lives.

Activity 2 - Roles of God the Father

In your groups, look at these scripture verses about the roles of God as Father.

What do these verses tell us about what God does?

Write your answers on cards and add them to the sticky wall.

Where or when have you seen an earthly father reflect or fulfil one of these roles?

For example: 2 Peter 3:9 says *"The Lord isn't slow about keeping his promises, as some people think he is. In fact, God is patient, because He wants everyone to turn from sin and no one to be lost."*

This verse reminds us that God keeps his promises. Can you think of a time when your father, or a father in your church family kept a promise.

Don't forget to give everyone in your group a chance to answer.

Link 2

These are some of the roles of God the Father that we can see reflected in earthly fathers.

Fathers often also need to be problem solvers. Let's find some volunteers to show us how good they can be at problem solving.

Activity 3 - How am I like God?

Ask 6 men to volunteer and give them one of the following tasks to do:

- ❖ Put together a flat pack item
- ❖ 6 men to stand on a picnic blanket and turn it over while all still standing on it

Who has God created fathers to be?

He has created them to be like Him. He has created fathers to reflect some of the character and roles of God. They are not God so they can't be perfect but they can keep on trying to be like God with his help.

Who has God created you to be?

God has created each of us to be like him too. He has created us to be like him and to try to live his way.

God has equipped each of us with unique characteristics and given us unique roles and responsibilities.

- ❖ Choose a characteristic card from the sticky wall (or write your own card) that represents a strength that you have.
- ❖ Choose a characteristic card from the sticky wall (or write your own card) that represents an area in which you would like to become more like God.
- ❖ Choose a role and responsibility card from the sticky wall (or write your own card) that God has given to you and ask for His help in fulfilling that role.

How can we step into these roles and continue in them?

- ❖ Keep these character and role cards somewhere that you will see them often.
- ❖ Make choices to act in ways that match up with who God is and what he does.
- ❖ We can ask other people to help us.
- ❖ We can ask God to help us.

Link 3

Today, whether we are fathers or not, we each are

trying to be more like God. We can and should share this with each other and encourage each other. We are going to take some time now to encourage the men that are here today.

Prayer Activity

We have some Scripture verses here that you might like to use to encourage someone right now by praying with them.

- ❖ Children can pray over their fathers.
- ❖ Wives can pray over their husbands.
- ❖ Fathers can pray over their families.
- ❖ Fathers can pray for themselves.
- ❖ Friends can pray over other men in the church family.

Allow time for the church family to pray over each other.

AND

Provide some blank cards on which people can write their own prayers.

AND

Provide a quiet space where people can go to pray on their own.

Benediction
